The management of acute dental pain continues to evolve as new clinical evidence, changing regulations, and the ongoing opioid epidemic reshape dental practice. Dentists remain among the leading prescribers of opioids for adolescents and young adults, making appropriate prescribing decisions critical to improving patient safety while providing effective pain control.

This comprehensive three-hour continuing education course fulfills the New York State opioid and addiction education requirement while providing practical guidance for everyday dental practice. Participants will review current science on opioid pharmacology, pain pathways, multimodal analgesia, and evidence demonstrating when non-opioid therapies provide superior pain relief. The course also explores opioid use disorder, substance use disorders, overdose prevention, and strategies for identifying patients at increased risk for addiction.

Course Objectives

- Describe the current epidemiology of opioid misuse, overdose, and substance use disorders in the United States and New York State.
- Differentiate between physical dependence, tolerance, opioid use disorder, and pseudoaddiction.
- Apply current CDC clinical practice recommendations and New York State opioid prescribing regulations to dental practice.
- Utilize New York's I-STOP Prescription Monitoring Program (PDMP) appropriately when prescribing controlled substances.
- Recognize patients at increased risk for opioid misuse, substance use disorder, and overdose using appropriate screening tools and clinical assessment.
- Discuss the pharmacology and dental implications of medications used to treat opioid use disorder, including buprenorphine, methadone, and naltrexone.
- Document prescribing decisions using informed consent, patient education, and risk mitigation strategies that meet current legal and professional standards.
- Incorporate current best practices into everyday dental practice to improve patient safety while maintaining regulatory compliance.
