

Dear Colleagues,

It was truly a great event and everyone taking part should be very proud of the outcome. The Greater Long Island Dental Meeting was the day after! We partnered with the Nassau County Dental Society for a one-day Sunday meeting this year on April 27, it was well received by attendees and sponsors.

Going forward we are facing many challenges as a profession. As of 2025, there are pressing challenges that impact both practitioners and patients. Staffing shortages and financial pressures are two of the biggest issues.


1. Staffing Shortages and Burnout

Recruitment and retention of dental professionals remain critical concerns. Approximately 60% of dentists report difficulties in hiring and keeping staff, particularly dental hygienists and assistants. Factors contributing to this include high turnover rates, burnout, and an aging workforce, with many professionals nearing retirement. Additionally, job satisfaction issues, such as demanding workloads and limited career advancement opportunities, exacerbate the problem.

2. Financial Pressures: Rising Costs and Low Reimbursements

Dental practices are grappling with escalating operational expenses, including wages, supplies, and equipment. However, insurance reimbursements, especially from Medicaid and Medicare, have not kept pace, leading to financial strain. This disparity forces many practices to reconsider their participation in certain insurance networks.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S EDITORIAL BILL PANZARINO

What's the problem?


I often think about the challenges organized dentistry is facing, in particular issues with declining membership market-share nationally and in NY State. I feel we (Suffolk County Dental Society) are an excellent proxy (a microcosm) for the larger organizations in terms of the way our members think, the issues

our members raise, how they vote on issues, etc. When we focused ourselves on increasing membership market-share, we were successful. We discovered what worked and what didn't work. Indeed, we grew membership market-share in 2021, 2022 and 2023 while states and national declined on that same metric. We don't have a trusted measure for our 2024 exit numbers as the Salesforce/ Fonteva statistics were not apples to apples comparison. We recognized we have membership crisis, we focused on it, utilized reservers and we delivered. So why hasn't this happened at the State and National level? Certainly we know these organizations are well intentioned. We have heard those organizations tell us Membership is the focus, but really, for 35 years or more it's been an irreversible trend.

I've had leadership positions in a large global corporation, when a true crisis emerged all recourses were brought to bear and focused on the crisis. These could be multi-year programs that required total alignment, incentive packages were aligned across the organization to deliver the desired outcome. I believe this can work in the national and state organizations. So why has this not happened? One difference I observe is the nature of leadership in the national and state organizations.

These organizations have annual leadership changes and this in itself can create significant challenges including:

- 1. **Lack of Continuity**: Frequent leadership turnover disrupts long-term strategic planning. New leaders may shift priorities, abandoning initiatives before they can yield results, leading to wasted resources and inconsistent direction.
- 2. **Erosion of Trust and Morale**: Employees



- 3. **Short-Term Focus**: Leaders with only a year in their role may prioritize quick wins over sustainable growth, undermining long-term goals for the sake of immediate results or personal legacy.
- 4. **Stakeholder Confusion**: External partners, clients, or stakeholders may find it difficult to maintain consistent relationships or trust when leadership changes annually, potentially weakening partnerships or credibility.
- 5. **Resistance to Change**: Employees may resist new initiatives if they expect the next leader to pivot again, leading to a culture of inertia or disengagement where teams "wait out" the current leader's tenure.
- 6. **Decision-Making Delays**: New leaders often need time to assess situations, which can slow down critical decisions. In a one-year cycle, this adjustment period consumes a significant portion of their tenure.

I suspect these things have contributed to thus far irreversible trend of membership market-share. What are your thoughts?



Introducing - SCDS Member Spotlight!

Our first member in the spotlight is Dr. Matthew A. Hanna, DMD

Rooted in community, driven by mentorship, and shaped by organized dentistry

Dr. Matthew Hanna's path to dentistry wasn't a straight line. As a college student majoring in biochemistry and obsessed with *CSI*, he initially envisioned a career in forensic science. But a summer internship at the NYC Medical Examiner's office changed that. "Working in a windowless lab all day, I realized I needed a people-oriented career," he says. "And during my wisdom tooth extraction, my oral surgeon casually suggested dentistry. That moment stuck."

Practicing Where It All Began

Today, Dr. Hanna is a partner at **Smithtown Family Dentistry**, practicing in the very community he grew up in. "I've treated teachers, classmates, their parents—and now their kids and grandkids. It's incredibly rewarding," he shares. "Some patients even travel from out of state to see me."

The Power of Organized Dentistry

Dr. Hanna's connection to organized dentistry began long before dental school. As a high schooler, he attended a Suffolk County Dental Society Installation Dinner honoring his cousin, Dr. Anthony Maresca—affectionately known as "Uncle Tony." Years later, during his residency at Stony Brook, Uncle Tony introduced him to Dr. Paul Leary, who became a mentor and example of leadership in organized dentistry.

"I assumed late-night meetings and advocacy trips were just what dentists did," he laughs. "But that was organized dentistry in action. Without it, I wouldn't be in my current practice or teaching at Stony Brook."

Dr. Hanna emphasizes that the **Suffolk County Dental Society** has been instrumental in his growth. "The CE, the vendor relationships, the peer collaboration—it's invaluable. But more than that, it's the mentors and friendships that shaped my path."

Teaching & Giving Back

With a mother who taught nursing at Suffolk Community College for 40 years, Dr. Hanna knew early on that teaching would be part of his career. Now a clinical instructor at **Stony Brook School of Dental Medicine**, he mentors dental students and residents both at school and in his private office.



"Teaching keeps me sharp and grounded," he says. "It reminds me to see the person, not just the procedure. And it's my way of giving back—just like my mentors gave to me."

Advice to New Dentists

Dr. Hanna encourages students and new dentists to get involved early. "Dentistry becomes second nature. What really matters is the network you build. That's what shapes how you serve your patients and your community."

His practical advice? "Live like a student a little longer to pay off loans—but invest in CE. And join the New Dentist Committee. Oh, and find a good accountant and lawyer!"

Life Outside the Office

A fun fact? Dr. Hanna has never had a cavity. He's also a proud father to Jacob (8) and Emily (6), and husband to Jessica. A fan of the Mets, Islanders, Knicks, and Giants, he also enjoys running, skiing, swimming, and soccer.

If he could change one thing about the profession, he'd start with access. "Dental education needs to be more affordable. And we need to raise insurance reimbursement so more patients can get quality care." Below—Dr. Hanna with Emily and Jacob



How would you like to pay your dues? As the NYSDA House of Delegates draws near, I want to remind our members that we have the ability to enact

change in how we pay our dues to the organized dentistry tripartite. And with that, I want to know your opinions. 


In other news, as we head into the Summer, we
