There is an important change for 2021 federal personal tax returns regarding the taxation of unemployment benefits. They are fully taxable for 2021. In 2020 there was a \$10,200 per person exclusion on the federal. NY State fully taxes it for both years.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE CRAIG E. SMITH, DMD

Greetings Dear Colleagues,

I'll briefly discuss five goals we are making progress on.

This inactivity has presented real challenges to having a meeting in 2022 and beyond. However, I'm excited to announce there will be a meeting this April 12-13th. Fran McHugh, meeting director, and the GLIDM board chaired by Dr. Jonke have worked extremely hard to bring Long Island a first class meeting this year. I implore you all to attend and bring your colleagues and staff. A Long Island meeting is a great member benefit and we need to try to preserve it.

3.) As of this writing, public mask mandates have been rescinded but remain in play for our practices. This is a reminder of the Covid waters we still navigate both as dental professionals and as members of our prospective communities. It has been my priority to insure our society gets the latest accurate info pertaining to Covid and its practice effects to our members in a timely fashion. It is comforting to know that we are well represented at the state level by our own Drs. Keven Henner and Guenter Jonke. They are NYSDA president and NYSDA Trustee respectively. Because of their presence, we'll be the first to know of changes state and locally.

We were the only component in the state with net positive numbers. 

I was honored to be asked to write this tribute about my long-time friend and colleague

Dr. Howard Schneider, despite the great sadness associated with his passing. Having known him for over 30 years, I know how special he was, personally and professionally. Howard had four passions in his life: his family, his pediatric dental practice, the community and the dental society. Well, maybe there was a fifth... Star Trek.

Howard was an important and active member of the Suffolk County Dental Society for 32 years. Before he became ill, he planned to become our future president, holding the position of secretary at the time. He held many other positions prior to this. He was a Huntington town delegate for many years, served on its Board of Directors and was a member of the planning board for the Greater Long Island Dental Meeting. However, the position he was most proud of was co-chairing the "Give Kids a Smile" Committee and the yearly event that provided donated dental care to underserved children.

Howard was an active member of the Huntington community and his temple. He served many roles at Temple Beth El including president of the TBE men's club, vice president of operations, a member of project HOPE (Helping Other People Eat) and ultimately temple president. He was very involved in the South Huntington school district as a member and officer of the Special Ed PTA. Recently, he had been president of another local organization dedicated to community service, "Dentists for a Better Huntington." One of his greatest joys was performing puppet shows throughout the community promoting dental health.

I was very fortunate to have the honor to work closely with him for many years professionally. Howard was the consummate pediatric dentist. He was fun and could be so silly with his patients. They loved him. He had a great love for treating children. I was particularly impressed with his skill in managing special needs patients. His skill and ethics in his private practice were exceptional.

Howard is survived by his wife Miriam and their two sons, Evan and Jordan. He adored them and always talked about them with great pride. My wife and I attended Howard and Mimi's wedding and were privileged to watch as their relationship and family grew. The boys have grown to be fine young men, inheriting many of Howard's best qualities.

Howard was a special person who touched many lives with his hard work and optimistic attitude as he took on his many roles in the community where he worked and lived. I will always remember his big smile and how much he enjoyed friendly conversations. I believe many others felt the same way as hundreds of people attended his memorial service in person and via live stream. His death leaves a void that his family, friends, colleagues and the community will have difficulty filling. You will be greatly missed my friend.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

On Wednesday February 23, 2022, the newly formed NYSDA Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Task Force hosted a Zoom Panel Event titled "The Black Experience in



Dentistry: Honoring the Past and Changing the Future." The NYSDA D, E & I Task Force was created by our NYSDA President Dr. Kevin Henner following a resolution that was adopted at the June 2021 House of Delegates to high-light February as Black History Month and showcase African-American member dentists that have made a significant contribution to our profession. This resolution was introduced by Dr. Fabiola Milord, Past President of the Nassau County Dental Society.

The panel was moderated by Dr. Laila Hishaw, founder of the National non-profit Diversity in Dentistry Mentorships, Inc. which encourages Blacks and other students to consider careers in dentistry by offering mentoring from middle to dental school.

The discussion covered a short history of black trailblazers in dentistry and organized dentistry, the obstacles faced for entry into dentistry, and how mentorship can make a difference. They also discussed how racism affects the dental school experience and the input it had on the members of the panel. Panelists included, among others, Dr. Raymond Gist, first African-American ADA President in 2010-2011, Dr. Darwin K. Hayes, Dental Director for the State of New Jersey, Dr. Sharel S. Sly, founder of Sistahs in Dentistry, a national organization for black women dentists, and Dr. Mark Bronson, Second Vice President of the ADA.

The program had an excellent acceptance nationwide with over 225 attendees including ADA members, non-member dentists, dental residents, students and auxiliaries. The program is available on NYSDA's Youtube page at https://youtu.be/2fBaJQ8aZvY.

The Task Force is comprised of members from most of the components around the state, members of the NYSDA Board and staff. The members themselves represent ethnic, minority, and gender diversity. We will continue to provide new programs to bring awareness to the various diverse groups within dentistry.



Ethics and Inclusion

Ustice, our fourth Principle in our Principle of Ethics and Code of Professional Conduct, states we "may exercise reasonable discretion in selecting patients for their practices, dentists shall not refuse to accept patients into their practice or deny dental service to patients because of the patient's race, creed, color, gender, sexual orientation or

gender identity or national origin. Our profession has always been based on the commitment to high ethical standards. There is an old saying that "*you only get one chance to make a first impression*". It is our intent to make everyone feel comfortable and inclusive in our offices. However, are we making the same efforts with LGBTQIA+ patients?

The definition of the LGBTQIA+ acronym is Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual and the plus sign represents members of the community who identify with a sexual orientation or gender identity that is not included within rest of the acronym. LGBTQIA+ individuals come from all walks of life. Many LGBTQIA+ have experienced discrimination, rejection and untoward reactions due to their gender identity or sexual orientation. But as we know dental issues, caries, periodontal issues, impacted third molars all carry no prejudice. LGBTQIA+ patients are acutely aware of subtle signs in our offices indicating whether they will be welcomed or not. We should think about, as we begin with any patient visit, are our medical history forms current? Do we have options for gender identity? For many of us, it has been a long time since we updated our forms and adding gender identity inclusive language on our forms is an important step to show all patients that they are welcome and accepted in our offices.

Second, which pronoun does your patient use? This also should be an option on your medical history form and when answered, will avoid any awkward moments with your patient among you and your staff. The inclusiveness of gender, sexuality and relationships on the forms will go a long way to provide a complete and accurate medical history. Respectful communication begins with your receptionist. Create a standard policy when welcoming patients. Have them ask the patient if the name on the file is the name he/she prefers to use. Every office should examine and review their current policies and procedures regarding patient's pronouns. The more prepared you and your staff are will go a long way to formulate an excellent initial patient experience.

Currently, many medical forms do not ask about sexual orientation. Adding this question will send a clear understanding and respect that you acknowledge their individuality and that your office is a safe space.

Gender neutral bathrooms for larger practices in is another way to instill a-welcoming atmosphere for transgender and non-binary patients.

By taking care of these simple steps, all of us can provide the best level of health for all of our patients, regardless of gender identity or sexual orientation. The National LGBT Health Education Center has additional information (<u>https://</u> www.lgbtgiahealtheducation.org)

Ground Broken at State U. For Mini-Medical Center

Ground was broken yesterday for a "mini-medical center" at the State University at Stony Brook—a temporary "staging area" for a massive University Health Sciences Center to be completed in the early 1970s.

The 114,000-square-foot building will permit preliminary academic programs to begin in September, 1970.

The overall center eventually will include schools of medicine, dentistry, nursing, allied health professions and social work, and contain a 400-bed university hospital and a 500-bed Veterans Administration hospital.

It will take a highly "innovative" approach to health sciences, education officials say.

Taking part in the groundbreaking yesterday were university president John S. Toll, Dr. Edmund D. Pellegrino, vice president for health sciences and dean of the School of Medicine, Dr. Howard Oaks, dean of the School of Dentistry, and Steven Schonfeld, president of the campus Pre-Medical Society.
