Endodontic Management of the Pediatric Patient Alexander Sanchez, DDS

This course will focus on various scenarios where endodontic intervention may be needed of the permanent tooth in the pediatric population. We will discuss various types of dental trauma, their clinical presentation, and management. We will also discuss management of the immature permanent tooth with pulpal disease and the decision-making process between either apexogenesis vs. apexification. Lastly, we will discuss the basics of regenerative endodontic procedures in the necrotic immature permanent tooth.
